Catherine Anderson was the first woman doctor to work at Ashton Infirmary and she worked with Elsie Inglis to set up the Scottish Women's Hospital during WW1. They worked in many areas of war torn Europe etc. and most of the staff were women.

**The Chief Constable of Clitheroe versus Louis Pasteur': Rabies in Stalybridge and Hyde, 1885-1895.**

Four people from Stalybridge and three from Hyde were bitten by a rabid dog; Some were sent to Paris and received Louis Pasteur's state-of-the-art rabies cure, the others stayed in the town and were given a herbal remedy pedalled by J R Hartley. The talk looks at medical cultures and social attitudes to dogs and the disease that existed at the time.
