



St John the Evangelist, Hurst Cross

Kings Road, Ashton under Lyne, OL6 8EZ

The church was consecrated by the first bishop of Manchester in 1849. It was funded by Oldham Whittaker, a local mill owner and was designed by Edwin Hugh Shelland in a stripped perpendicular style, typical of its period. Later building work took place in 1862 including the tower and spire, a significant local landmark. The architect was George Shaw of Saddleworth. The unique dark oak reredos, panelling and artefacts, as well as the stained-glass windows, are all his work.

Displays, leaflets and talks, meet our famous stuffed owl, church registers on view plus activities for children. Refreshment available.


St Stephen's Church, Audenshaw Guide Bridge, Audenshaw, M34 5HJ

Dukinfield Town Hall Tour

King Street, Dukinfield, SK16 4LA

Dukinfield Town Hall was built between 1899 and 1901 at a cost of £15,000. Built in the Gothic style and of Accrington brick construction with Yorkshire sandstone dressing and a slate roof.

It is two storeys high with a symmetrical front and a central clock

tower. The architects were Messrs John Eaton and Sons of Ashton under Lyne.

Hyde

Hyde Chapel

Knott Lane, Gee Cross, SK14 5BS

The first chapel on this site was built in 1708. The new chapel was opened on 5 July 1848. With its tower and spire, and the long nave and chancel it is often mistaken for the parish church. The architects Bowman and Crowther, using what was considered at the time to be the most progressive style, created a building of historical importance.

Michael Holmes will be playing at intervals during the day on our historic restored pipe organ and Revd Andrew Parker will be giving one of his wonderful talks at 2.00 pm.

Hyde Town Hall Tour

Market Street, Hyde, SK14 1AL

Built in 1883/84 and designed by James William Beaumont, a leading Manchester architect, with a sympathetic extension in 1913. It achieved Grade II listing because of quality of craftsmanship and detailing to exterior and of the decorative treatment of principal public areas.

Tameside's gem. One of the oldest cruck-framed building in Greater Manchester.

There will be numerous displays including Scouting paraphernalia and church records. A slide show will display images of old Hyde, St Thomas, St John's, Godley and St Stephen's, Flowery Field. Refreshments available.


