Albion Church

Stamford Street, Ashton-under-Lyne, OL6 6QQ

You can see Albion Church the Grade II* gothic building towering above Park Parade A635. Don't just drive past, call in and see "Creativity Unwrapped": Stained glass windows by Burne-Jones, installed by William Morris, Pilkington tile war memorial designed by Gordon M Forsyth and hear the Lewis Grade II* organ. Café serving snacks and lunch.

Ashton Old Baths

We have transformed the iconic Victorian swimming pool into a dynamic creative community. You will be able to experience the Baths first hand. Please note there is restricted disabled access for part of the tour, and tours are limited to 15-20 people.

The Hyde War Memorial Trust was established in 1921, when 150 acres of land was purchased in memory of the 710 men of Hyde who died in the First World War. This is now Werneth Low Country Park. There will be short guided tours of the Low. In addition, there will be a chance to handle some of the small, treasured collection of personal items belonging to the 710 men and their families. The Visitor Centre café will be open.
