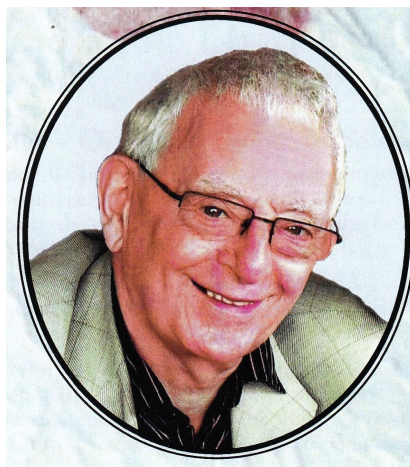

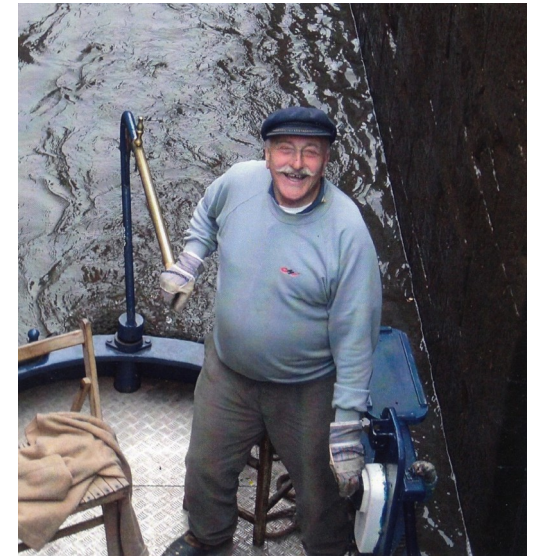
Eric Wright
